**ST. VINCENT CEMETERY GUIDELINES:** Mowing season is here. As a reminder! 1) Artificial flowers in saddles attached to the stone are permitted at any time. One shepherd's hook per memorial is allowed. Hooks must be placed near the stone so they do not hinder mowing or digging of the grave. All other wires, stakes or decorations are not allowed during mowing season and will be removed. Containers of cut flowers left at the time of burial will be removed by cemetery personnel within a few days. 2) The American flag made of wood and cloth is permitted. It should be placed within 6" of the memorial. Frayed flags should be removed. 3) Votive candles and glass vases are never permitted. 4) Plants, shrubs or mulch of any type are not permitted. 5) Any item which detracts from the beauty of the cemetery or hinders mowing or digging a grave will be removed. 6) Only grass may be planted the length and width of a grave. 7) Any decorations not allowed by the SVDPC will be removed and discarded. Please remove those items that do not fall under these guidelines. Please help us keep our cemetery beautiful.
